To whom it may concern:

Mr. Horn is a patient under my care. This letter follows and expands upon my prior correspondence of April 10, 2026.

Mr. Horn has reported continuing exposure to airborne contaminants in his apartment, which he attributes to volatile organic compounds released from a portable air-conditioning exhaust assembly installed by his property management. He has described symptoms consistent with that type of exposure, including headache, nausea, fatigue, cognitive difficulty, and disrupted sleep. He previously discontinued a prescribed breathing device because of concerns about the air quality in the unit.

I understand that Mr. Horn has been displaced from the apartment and is currently staying away from the environment (as any reasonable person would). I would strongly advise that Mr. Horn not re-enter the apartment while these issues remain unresolved. I am quite concerned about the physical and mental health effects of this matter. The combination of displacement, the ongoing need to advocate for himself, and uncertainty about his living situation contributes to significant physical and mental stress.
